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HAND-IN-HAND CHARITY PROGRAM

Individual Cases – Dialysis Aid

In the fourth quarter of 2018, our Dialysis Aid Program supported 26 kidney patients who are either low income earners or unemployed due to their medical condition, compared to 18 supported cases within the same period in 2017. Each patient receives a dialysis fee subsidy ranging from RM130 to RM1,430 per month for a period of six (6) months or more to ease their burden. From these 26 beneficiaries, 4 are new cases. Special thanks to Yayasan Kossan for their continued support to fund five of our beneficiaries. The beneficiaries listing are as follow:

LIEW TZER GIO

Liew is a 33 years old insurance agent and Grab driver. He suffers from high blood pressure, kidney disease, and anaemia. He has now recovered from his parathyroidectomy operation in August 2018, and can now walk or sit freely and no longer in pain, GHCA will continue to support his weekly haemodialysis epoetin injection fee.

HAND-IN-HAND CHARITY PROGRAM



LOW KAR WAI

Low, 39, used to work as a freelance script writer for films. With his SOCSO aid approved in August 2018 that reduces his dialysis expenses to RM160 monthly, he no longer needs our support once we assisted him in October 2018 to pay off his outstanding dialysis fee. He had also just received a freelance assistant job offer for a film project.



LOH YUN SHEONG

Mr Loh is 53 years old and has undergone dialysis treatment for more than 10 years. He requires epoetin injection for his treatment due to anaemia, where his haemoglobin level drops to 6.5 in July 2018. With treatment, his condition improves in November 2018, with his haemoglobin level increasing to 8.0.



THOO FOONG MING

Madam Thoo is a 62 years old widow. She is a dialysis patient for years and now works hard to sell toys in the night market whenever she is free. However, in November 2018, she reported her hands and body have become weaker due to aging and she might not be able to operate her stall that often, where she only earns around RM10 to RM20 a day.



PASCHAL GOMEZ

Paschal Gomez is 77 years old and was diagnosed with Crohn's Disease and kidney failure. He recently had an operation to insert a fistula on his hand for his treatment, which reduces his viral infection chances. In our December 2018 visit, he has started using the hand fistula for dialysis treatment, and his dialysis centre is subsidising his Vitamin D injection to strengthen his body.



SAMEY @ ANNASAMY A/L KANNAN

Mr Samey, age 71, suffers from diabetes, high blood pressure, and kidney disease. He is a leg amputee and uses a wheelchair and artificial limb for mobility. His encounters some documentation issues with his MOH subsidies application in July 2018 and is now resubmitting his application for further consideration from MOH.

HAND-IN-HAND CHARITY PROGRAM



NAGAMAH A/P GOPAL

Nagamah, 68 years old, is diagnosed with kidney failure and she is supported by her daughter. Madam Nagamah is showing signs of memory and dementia issues. Thankfully, her MOH subsidy application has been approved recently, so she will no longer requires support from GHCA, with our final support being for October 2018.



LEDCHUMANAN A/L GURUNaidu

Mr Ledchumanan is 64 years old and needs RM1,800 monthly to cover for his dialysis fees. His household expenses are catered by both his children. His treatment is still ongoing and he is still waiting for his MOH subsidies application which was submitted in August 2018.



POOMALAI A/L VELLASAMY

Mr Poomalai is 68 years old and is on dialysis treatment 3 times weekly. During our December 2018 visit, Poomalai's health has deteriorated, with his leg getting painful and he is drowsy after his dialysis treatment. His wife takes him for clinic check-up and she is glad that GHCA and their son is still support them currently.



DEVINDRAN A/L MONIAM

Devindran is 35 years old and has walking complications. With MOH's increased subsidies recently, his treatment cost has been reduced to RM130 monthly. His treatment is still ongoing and he is still on the lookout for suitable location to operate a car wash business so that he can be financially independent.



LEE KAH CHUN

Mr Lee is 30 years old but has been diagnosed with kidney failure, diabetes, and dry gangrene. He had amputated both his legs and one finger due to his condition. From December 2018 onwards, Tzu Chi Foundation took over support for his treatment fee. Unfortunately, GHCA were being informed that Mr Lee had passed away in January 2019.

HAND-IN-HAND CHARITY PROGRAM



GOPAL A/L SINNTHAMBY

Mr Gopal is an unemployed 62 years old man. His wife's savings has been almost depleted to pay for his dialysis treatment. During our visit in December 2018, they thanked GHCA for the support and informed that they have also recently received a donation of RM4,500 from another charity organisation to help pay the balance of Mr Gopal's dialysis fees.



MAH LAI MUN

Ms Mah suffers from blurred vision, diabetes and kidney failure. Her partner takes care of her during the day and work as a Grab car driver at night. She had removed her left eyeball due to an infection. During our December 2018 visit, she was reported to be drowsy after her dialysis treatment. Her partner is trying hard to take care of her and motivates her to never give up.



CHEN SIEW CHIN

Madam Chen has high blood pressure, diabetes, and kidney failure. Two of her children had abandoned her, while another was unable to support her financially. Her relative who used to provide her with shelter and meals were no longer able to do so due to health issues themselves. She now rents a room in an apartment since October 2018.



LAI SANG

Mr Lai, 55, works as a part time painter. He was abandoned by his 3 children and lives in a dilapidated factory. He met with a car accident recently and was discharged a week later with minor injury. Support for Mr Lai ended in October 2018 with the return of his daughter from Singapore, who will be supporting his living and medical expenses.



YEONG MEE LIN

Madam Yeong is a 67 years old mother suffering from kidney failure, mild stroke, blurred vision, and knee pain. Her second daughter provides her with RM800 monthly allowance. She went through a laser surgery to treat her blurred vision and can see better now. She was advised by doctor to undergo a thyroid operation in 2019 for excessive parathyroid hormones.

HAND-IN-HAND CHARITY PROGRAM



YONG KOON TAK

Mr Yong, 59, has diabetes, high blood pressure, heart ailment, and kidney failure. His wife works as a clerk to support the family. With his ongoing treatment, he looks healthier in our recent visit. His eldest son had just graduated with a medical degree and will soon be continuing his master's degree. He is hopeful that his son will become a doctor who could then take care of him.



CHONG CHUN ONN

Mr Chong, 36 years old, used to work as chef in Singapore but his medical condition changes all that. He successfully underwent an operation to insert a fistula into his hand for his treatment. GHCA assisted him further with deposit for a motorcycle, which he uses to secure a job as a front desk receptionist at a karaoke joint, earning approximately RM1,000 monthly.



LIM WAI CHEAH

Ms Lim, 22, suffers from anaemia, diabetes, kidney failure, and blindness. She relied on her mother's Socso pension for her medical fees and household expenses. Her mother unfortunately passed away in December, which terminates the Socso pension. While she appeals for the pension reinstatement, GHCA will increase the monthly subsidies for Ms Lim to RM1,000.



TAN HAN BEE

Madam Tan, 68 years old, suffers from high blood pressure and kidney failure. She runs a sewing business in a small shop but as the rental increase, she faced difficulty to sustain her business. Support is still ongoing for Madam Tan.



MENG KWAI SIM

Madam Meng is a 66 years old single lady who stays alone. She had previously worked as a babysitter, promoter, and assistant supervisor. She was diagnosed with thyroid cancer, high blood pressure, and kidney failure, which prevented her from working. In October 2018, she had applied for MOH subsidies and is now waiting for the approval process.

HAND-IN-HAND CHARITY PROGRAM



LIM CHIN GEE

Mr Lim, aged 49, lives in a shop lot at Klang. He was diagnosed with kidney failure, high blood pressure, and heart ailment, with only 60% of his heart being functional. His wife and daughter work as waitresses to support the family. Support is still ongoing for his dialysis subsidy and monthly groceries support.



KRISHNAN A/L RAJOO

Krishnan, aged 63, was a lorry driver who was diagnosed with kidney failure. He has used up all his saving for his dialysis treatment. His wife also had a stroke two months ago, with him and his breadwinner son taking turns to look after her needs. GHCA will be subsidising RM1,000 of his dialysis treatment fee for 6 months starting from December 2018 to reduce his burden.



YONG KIM LIN

Madam Yong, 71, is a retiree and has high blood pressure, diabetes, and kidney failure. She used to run a wedding photography shop with her husband. She had used up all her savings for her dialysis treatment and was about to give up her treatment due to her financial constraints. GHCA decided to subsidise RM720 of her dialysis fee for 6 months starting from December 2018.



ROSLI BIN ABDUL HAMID

Rosli, 49, was a lorry driver with high blood pressure, kidney disease, and diabetes and had amputated his right leg in 2016. He has a wife and 3 children. His dialysis fee was subsidised by Socso. GHCA will support his epoetin injection fee of RM160 for 6 months from December 2018 to ease his burden, as he is currently relying on the welfare department to put food on the table.



LELA A/P RATNASAMY

Lela, 38, formerly a teacher, has hypertension since young and was recently diagnosed with kidney failure. She had impairment in both her eyes and will slowly become blind. She stays with her brother and could no longer work due to her health condition. GHCA will support her full dialysis fee for 3 months while we work on ways to get support for her treatment.

HAND-IN-HAND CHARITY PROGRAM

Individual Cases – Family Care

In the fourth quarter of 2018, we reached out to 43 underprivileged families, compared to 25 families within the same period in 2017. From these 43 beneficiaries, 12 are new cases. Special thanks to Project Cabel and Cari Online Media for funding our beneficiaries in quarter four.

TAN LEE HU

Mr Tan, 41 years old, is a sole breadwinner father of 2 with a hearing-impaired wife. He was a sub-contractor but is now working odd jobs due to his knee condition. In December 2018, he started helping his friend to sell Chinese New Year decoration items to earn some income before his coming knee operation in March 2019.



MAHESWARY A/P RAMASANDIRAN

Madam Maheswary, 41 years old, worked as a cleaner and earned around RM1,000 a month. She had to cover her house rental, groceries, and take care of her bedridden cousin brother. Support for Maheswary is still ongoing, as the condition of her cousin brother deteriorated in December 2018.



ARULSEVI A/P PERIASAMY

Madam Arulsevi, 59, is the wife of GHCA's Dialysis Aid beneficiary, Gopal. She had used up all her EPF savings to cover her husband's medical fees. In December 2018, she was preoccupied with taking care of Gopal, who recently had bouts of post-dialysis leg pain and dizziness.



PREMA A/P GANAPATHY

Prema is a 43 years old single mother of four. She works as a labourer in bakeries and restaurants, earning RM500. She used to start a homemade ice cream and rojak business, but it failed. In our December 2018 visit, she had attended a few interview sessions for factory operator positions and is currently waiting for further news.

HAND-IN-HAND CHARITY PROGRAM



YAP EN BOO @ YAP AH MAI

Madam Yap, 71 years, suffers from diabetes and high blood pressure. She has 9 children, with 7 of them married but did not provide allowance to her. Her son is taking care of her, together with her daughter who has Down Syndrome and is currently still looking for a suitable job.



NG SIEW KIAU

Madam Ng, 67, has epilepsy and is unemployed due to her condition. She relies on Social Welfare aid for her rental and get her meals via our Lunch Box for the Hungry program. With the program extension to 5 days a week, she is more relieved from her financial pressure now.



LIM CHIN GEE

Mr Lim, 49, is a GHCA Dialysis Aid beneficiary. We provided his family with a RM300 monthly grocery subsidy in addition to the dialysis aid to ease his burden. Groceries subsidy support is still ongoing for Mr Lim to help ease his burden.



DAYANIDHI A/L ARUMUGAM SHANMUGAM

Dayanidhi 11, has cerebral palsy and can only consume PediaSure milk as his diet. We assisted her mother to market her homemade Muruku to nearby restaurants but there were no take ups. Fortunately, in November 2018, there are donors who supported extra diapers for Dayanidhi.



LACHEMY A/P PERISAMY

Lachemy, 67, single, suffers from diabetes, high blood pressure, and depression. She has some good news where she obtained a job as a cleaner, JKM RM350 monthly support, and room rental income of RM250 and therefore would no longer require our support after November 2018.



NEROSHA A/P KRISHNAN

Nerosha, 25, met with a motor accident that dislodged her intestine outside her body. She needs to use colostomy bag to pass motion for the rest of her life. Despite this, she runs a detergent and ice-cream business from home. She recently took part in the 2018 Wheelchair Queen Malaysia and won the 2nd runner-up title.

HAND-IN-HAND CHARITY PROGRAM



NG CHING MEE

Madam Ng, 63, is taken care by her daughter. She has osteoporosis, backbone spinal compression, and constant pain. Thankfully, her health condition improves, and in November 2018, her daughter requested us to stop the support so that we could extend our assistance to others in need.



NG JOE ZE

Joe Ze, 11, has learning disability. He lives with his 7 siblings, father, mother, and grandmother. We had been providing for his tuition fees, which ended in November 2018. He has begun helping his mother to sell cakes, eggs, and cheese tarts in restaurant, earning around RM50 daily.



PARAMESWARY A/P RAJINDRA

Parameswary is a tailor with two children, one having Down Syndrome and requires extra care. GHCA assisted her to apply for aid from the Social Welfare Department which was approved in September 2018. With the aid, she can now self-sustain and no longer requires our assistance.



SARAVANAN A/L SIVALINGAM

Saravanan has diabetes, cataract, and wheelchair bound. His health condition deteriorated in December 2018 and he needs to start haemodialysis treatment in January 19 due to kidney failure. Thus, GHCA will be extending his transportation subsidies period.



SEONG YOKE SIM

Madam Seong, 87-years-old, is bed-ridden and has high blood pressure. Her single mother daughter takes care of her along with three primary-school-going children. In December 2018, a private charity will be providing support to her, so GHCA will be stopping our support.



TAN HOCK CHUAN

Mr Tan has found job as a daily wage helper in a renovation company, earning up to RM900 monthly. His wife has also found job as a part time cleaner. In our November 2018 visit, they can now survive with both job incomes and no longer needs our assistance.

HAND-IN-HAND CHARITY PROGRAM



THERESAMAH A/P SAMUEL PILLAI

Madam Theresamah 64, has diabetes and used to rely on her retired husband's pension for a living. She now works part-time as restaurant cleaner, earning RM360 monthly. Her blood sugar level has also improved from 9.5 to 6.5 now with our support in diabetic milk and chicken essence.



RANJIT KAUR AP KARTAR SINGH

Madam Ranjit, 56, is a mentally ill stroke patient who faints occasionally and unable to work. She stays with her sister and 5 children. During our October 2018 visit, GHCA decided to extend our RM300 monthly assistance period to her family to cover their food expenses.



GAMMALA A/P P MUNISAMY

Gammala, 65, is a single mother with 2 mentally disabled children. She has high blood pressure and relies on Social Welfare aid for a living. In October 2018, her son found a job as a lorry driver assistant and now will no longer requires our aid.



ALVIN A/L J RICHARD

Alvin lost his job in April 2018 due to a hand injury. He has now secured a job as an operator in an Aluminium factory, earning RM1,500, and will no longer needs our aid after October 2018. He is thankful for the support during his time in need.



CHUA AI KONG

Mr Chua, 63, is diagnosed with Parkinson disease. He used to be a fisherman but now works as a labourer to peel off shrimp shell. With his wife's passing recently, he started to focus more time on work and earns a better income now. He no longer requires our assistance after November.



TOH BEE CHOO

Madam Toh, 41, is a widow staying alone in her ancestral house. She suffers from high blood pressure and was unable to work long hours. In our October 2018 visit, she is changing to cooking at home to save cost to better manage her finance. She thanked us for the assistance and will no longer require our support after November 2018.

HAND-IN-HAND CHARITY PROGRAM



ELWIN RAJ A/L A. EASTER

Elwin, 16 years old, is bed-ridden, suffers from muscular dystrophy and severe scoliosis, and can only take milk as his diet. His mother, Gomathi, is one of our beneficiaries for business start-up support. His condition remained unchanged, so we will be extending our support until May 2019.



DAVID A/L ANTHONIAPAN

David, 51, is wheelchair-bound and had his right hand amputated. He has a young daughter and sells handcraft in Batu Caves for a living. His legs are in constant pain. He plans to move to his brother's house in Johor in 2019 and we will be extending our support to him until May 2019.



GOMATHI A/P RAMASAMY

Gomathi, 43, a single mother of 2, was jobless. We assisted her to start a nasi lemak and kuih stall to support her family. In December 2018, she has expanded her business to include delivery to construction sites and her neighbourhood with her nephew's help during the school holidays.



HE MOI ENG

Madam He, 51, is a widow with 2 daughters. One of them is a slow learner. She has high blood pressure and kidney failure and can barely work. On our recent visit, she was admitted to the hospital due to asthma. Therefore, we will extend our support to her until February 2019.



KRISHNAKUMAR A/L ARUMUGAM

Krishnakumar, 37, a father of four, has pancreas stone. He was a security guard but now repairs appliances part time from home due to ill health. GHCA helps his wife starts a door-to-door beauty and bridal services. They will be opening a small beauty shop nearby their apartment in 2019.



AMELIN TEOH MEI SUN

Ms Amelin, 19 years old, was diagnosed with second stage brain tumour. GHCA received news that she had passed in December 2018. Our deepest condolences to her family on her passing. May her soul rest in peace.

HAND-IN-HAND CHARITY PROGRAM



KAMALAN A/P ELLAPAN

Kamalan, 88, has high blood pressure, diabetes, heart ailment, and stroke complications. In our recent visit, her son is now providing for her. Coupled with her recently approved JKM aid and milk provision from other donors, she no longer requires our assistance after December 2018.



LEE POH YOK

Madam Lee, 66, is the mother to one of our Family Care beneficiaries, Mr Yap, who passed away in June 2018, and whom used to be GHCC's Lunch Box for the Hungry program supplier. We are extending her with grocery subsidy assistance of RM300 monthly to lessen her family's burden.



MURUGAN A/L RAGAVAN

Murugan, 39, was one of our Dialysis Aid beneficiaries. We helped him to start a fruit delivery business, and it has now picked up, earning him RM1,500 to RM2,000 monthly. He no longer requires our assistance in December 2018.



VANITHA A/P THAMIZARASAN

Vanitha, 36, a mother of 8 with an abusive husband whom had left home, was as a cleaner in a hotel, earning RM900 monthly. She lost her job in December 2018 and is now seeking for new one. GHCA assists her with RM300 monthly groceries during her time in need.



MAZNIZAH SHAMSIA BINTI KOSNI

Maznizah, 39, is a jobless mother of 3. She has high blood pressure and is seeing a psychiatrist to treat her mental condition. GHCA is providing her with RM300 grocery aid and we are motivating her to continue her search for a job.



NORLIZAWATI BINTI WAH

Norlizawati, 35, is pregnant. Her husband injured his leg in an accident and is on medical leave until 2019. Thus, she has difficulty feeding her school-going 4 children. GHCA assisted her with RM300 monthly groceries aid to ease her burden. She has safely delivered her baby in December 2018 and her husband will also resume work soon.

CHAN SIEW HONG

Chan, 32, suffers from mental illness and stays alone in a filthy house. She used to stay with her grandmother before she passed away. She was noticed by a GHCA volunteer at a dumpsite. Our team worked hard to clean up her house and will be providing her with monthly groceries aid.



GRACE A/P MALAYAN

Grace, 33, is a factory operator, mother of 6 who was abandoned by her husband. She is the sole breadwinner of the family, earning RM700 with a further RM450 from JKM aid. GHCA is providing her with RM300 monthly groceries aid.



SELVAMONEY A/L SABASTIAN

Selvamoney, 69, has Stage 3 colon cancer. His wife used to work with Sime Darby but is now unemployed after being diagnosed with thyroid and osteoporosis. His only income comes from JKM's RM300 monthly aid. He needed monthly supplies of colostomy bags for defecation.



CHONG LI YOON

Madam Chong, 37, is a mother of 5. Her children hardly have any nutritious food for their growth development. Her husband works as a freelance cabinet installer assistant and is paid on a project basis. As for now, he does not have any job and they are worried about their children.



KAMALA A/P MUTHIAH

Kamala, 64, lives with her daughter at a low cost flat. She has diabetes, cataract, heart ailment, and high blood pressure. Her daughter lost her job as a sales assistant after having to frequently take leave to send her mother to the hospital. She is now unemployed and is looking for a new job.



PACKIAMARY A/P AROKIASAMY

Packiamary, 61, stays with her bed-ridden husband. She has breast cancer, heart ailment, blurred vision, asthma, and high blood pressure. Her children neglected them. They depended on JKM aid for their living. GHCA assists her with her grocery expenses and diaper supplies.

THANAVALLI A/P AMMASIS

Thanavalli, 42, is a housewife. Her husband, a part time lorry mechanic, had a heart attack and will undergo angiogram in January 2019. He had been unemployed for 4 months due to his condition. Thanavalli is looking for a part-time tuition teacher job to relieve her sick husband's burden.



INNASMUTHU A/L SAVARIAPAN

Innasmuthu, 46, a father of 5, worked as a logistic driver but quit after suffering from high blood pressure, diabetes, and blurred vision. He had dialysis treatment 3 times a week, which was supported by Socso. They rely on Socso pension and JKM aid to cover their household expenses.



KALA A/P SUBRAMANIAM

Kala, 36, is unemployed as she must look after her 4 children. Her husband works as a lorry attendant and earned RM1,500 monthly, which is insufficient to cover their monthly expenses. Therefore, Kala and her husband are looking for a part time job to increase their income. GHCA is assisting her family with a RM300 monthly aid.

SHOBANA A/P MOTHU

Shobana, 37, is the wife of our Family Care beneficiary Krishnakumar. GHCA supported her to start a door-to-door beauty & bridal services business with her past experiences and provided for her tools and other necessities for the start-up. It earns her RM600 monthly. She is now planning to open a small beauty shop nearby their apartment in 2019.



LETCHMY A/P KANNA

Letchmy, 67, has bilateral knee osteoarthritis. Her legs are in pain all the time and she has to undergo knee gel injections for recovery. She was taken care of by her security guard son, who could not afford to pay for the treatment. To ease her burden, GHCA subsidised RM1,000 for her treatment fees. In our December 2018 visit, she was no longer in pain and is recovering fast.



CHONG CHUN ONN

Chong is one of our dialysis beneficiaries. He worked as a chef in Singapore before he had kidney failure. He almost gave up his life but GHCA motivated him by urging him to look for a job and subsidising him RM2,500 to get a motorcycle to go to work. He successfully secured a job as a front desk receptionist, earning approximately RM1,000 monthly.

HAND-IN-HAND CHARITY PROGRAM



LETCHUMEE A/P RAMASAMY

Letchumee, 55, oversees Pusat Jagaan Kanak-Kanak Berlian, looking after 20 children. GHCA provided her with 1 sewing machine to teach basic sewing skills to 4 teenagers in the centre who wanted to learn how to sew Indian clothing such as saree. In our December 2018 visit, the children were learning sewing skills fast, a skill which can be useful to them in future.



VANITHA A/P THAMIZARASAN

Vanitha, 36, a mother of 8 with an abusive husband whom had left home, was as a cleaner in a hotel. GHCA provided her with cooking appliances such as stove, wok, rice cooker, and utensils, which she is desperately in need of to cook for her children, as she previously had to borrow these from her mother's house.



CHAN SIEW HONG

Ms Chan, 32, earns a living by collecting rubbish on the street. She has mental illness and lives in a dilapidated house. GHCA's Kampar team led by Michelle overhauled her home by cleaning, equipping it with a toilet and basic furniture, and electrical rewiring. We also helped her get a replacement for her lost IC that enables her to seek treatment from government hospital.



ANAS ESHAAL AFHAMI

Anas, 1 year old, suffers from EIEE with KCNQ2 Mutation. He is prone to infection. His father quit his job to look after him. His mother is a school teacher by day and home tutor by night to support the household. GHCA provided a one-off diaper supplies for the family and referred them to another charity group who will be providing them with further diaper supplies.



MURUGAN A/L RAGAVAN

Murugan, 40, is a kidney dialysis patient. He is a fruit seller with unstable income. He had difficulty paying for an operation to fix his faulty fistula, which could be fatal as he needs it for his haemodialysis treatment. GHCA subsidise half his treatment fees, with the balance paid by his fruit company and friends. He was so thankful for the help and hopes to recover soon to be able to get back to work.

HAND-IN-HAND CHARITY PROGRAM



MAGESWARY A/P R. MUTHUVEERAN

Mageswary, 46, is a mother of 5. She worked as a factory operator. Due to her unhealthy noisy work environment, her hearing was affected. GHCA comes into the picture by providing her with a hearing aid for her to regain her hearing. She was so glad to receive help from GHCA and is now planning to find a new job that is not exposed to noise pollution.



MURNI BINTI ABDUL RAZAK

Murni, 33, is physically impaired and unable to walk due to weak leg bone. She lives with her elderly parents who have difficulty to carry her around due to old age. She had previously relied on borrowing her neighbour's wheelchair. GHCA provided her with a new wheelchair to ease her mobility, especially for her journey to the hospital.



MALA A/P RAMASAMY AMBALAM

Mala, 49, mother of 3, is a dialysis patient. She operates a convenience shop for time flexibility to go for haemodialysis treatment. She needs to undergo a fistula operation and was unable to pay for the operation with her unstable income. GHCA subsidise half of her operation fees, with the balance being paid by her relatives. She was thankful for the help, which was a life saviour.



ONG CHIK YEE

Madam Ong, 78, lives alone. She survives on collecting recyclables and JKM aid of RM350. She used to cycle to GHCC for our Lunch Box for the Hungry program but was no longer able to do so after falling and injuring her leg. GHCA assisted her with one-time groceries aid and also provided her with a mattress after discovering that she slept on the floor. Her leg will recover soon in January 2019 and she will resume getting her lunches from GHCC.

Orang Asli Villages

CITY EXPEDITION FOR ORANG ASLI CHILDREN

GHCA had organised a 2D1N trip for 35 Orang Asli children and their guardians from Pahang to the city of Kuala Lumpur on 22 December 2018. They were brought to visit places such as the Great Heart Community Center (GHCC), Petrosains – The Discovery Centre, and the National Planetarium. Accompanied by 20 volunteers, the children were excited to learn about science through various interactive exhibits and watched a 3D space video in the Planetarium. EQUIPING CHILDREN WITH BAKING SKILLS

11 students with culinary background from Sunway University visited the Padmasambhava Children Loving Association on 6 October 2018 to impart 54 children there with age ranging from 4 years old till 19 years old with cookies baking skill so that they could utilise it to earn some funds. Baking skill was identified as an area that can generate sustainable income for the children. This idea was mooted by the students after learning that the home is desperately in need of funding to relocate their home.



A DAY OF CARE FOR CHILDREN HOMES

On 17 October 2018, two groups of students from the Chung Hwa Independent High School allocated their time after school to arrange for a visitation to two children's home in Klang concurrently, namely the Padmasambhava Children Loving Association and the Happy Home. The students were on site to help out with cleaning up the home, providing homework tutoring session for the children, as well as teaching the children on how to make their very own "pizza bread"!



ORIGAMI AND MOCKTAIL FUN FOR ORANG ASLI CHILDREN

8 culinary arts students from Sunway University organised a fun and engaging morning for 20 Orang Asli children from Promise Home on 26 October 2018 via an Origami and Mocktail workshop session. The students first taught the children to make a mouth-watering mocktail drink using lime juice and Ribena, followed by a session of Origami paper-folding tutorials where the children learnt to fold paper t-shirts, paper cranes, and paper yachts.

HOPE READING AT SEKINCHAN

With 150 Chinese dictionaries and story books sponsored by Sin Chew Daily, the last session of the Hope Reading Program in 2018 was carried out in Sekinchan! Attended by 150 students from SJK(C) Yoke Kuan and SJK(C) Kian Sit, the event was organised by 40 students from Taylor's University School of Pharmacy to cultivate the reading culture and usage of dictionary, encourage acts of doing good via the sharing of charity act examples, and creating awareness on the need to protect the environment.



RELAXATION WORKSHOP FOR CHILDREN

16 children that were enrolled in GHCC's Classes for the Children program were treated to a Relaxation Workshop organised by 4 volunteer students from Monash University on 3 November 2018. The student volunteers conducted various creative games with the aim to teach the children stress management concepts and tips on staying in a relaxed state. The workshop received great participation from the children.



NURTURING THE YOUNG SCIENTISTS

35 underprivileged children from Rumah Amal Kasih Bestari had the opportunities to become young scientists for the day when they were brought to visit the Petrosains Science Discovery Centre on 11 November 2018. 7 students from Sunway Student Volunteers organised the educational trip, where the children were able to explore on the science and technology behind the energy industry by using fun and interactive approaches. Gifts were also prepared for the children to bring home as memento for the trip.

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Lunch Box for the Hungry

In the fourth quarter of 2018, we have conducted 69 Lunch Box for the Hungry sessions, distributing a total of 11,058 lunch boxes to our beneficiaries. Starting 1 November 2018, we have expanded our distribution sessions to cover Wednesday and Friday as well, with the program now effectively providing lunch boxes to the needy every day that GHCC is operating, from Tuesday to Saturday, five days a week.

Beginning October 2018, our program was also extended to support 58 underprivileged students from Tabika Kemas Baitul Akmal (30 students) and SK (1) Simpang Lima (28 students), supporting their luncheon every Monday, Wednesday, and Friday. As of end December 2018, there are a total of 252 beneficiaries who are enrolled in the program.

Our appreciation goes to Benevolence Life Code, Pertubuhan Penganut Buddha Ci En Lin, Ave Maria Soup Kitchen, and Mr Mahdi Azin Zadeh for acting as sponsors for the program in Q4 2018.



TCM Medical Check Up for the Needy

In the fourth quarter of 2018, we served 329 patients through 28 sessions of Traditional Chinese Medicine (TCM) check-up. The sessions were held at our newly expanded TCM room that provides better space and comfort to the patients. Each of the session's time was also extended to 1 additional hour. 74.1% from the patients seeking treatment from our program reported an improvement to their medical condition in the quarter under review. Beginning December 2018, we had also expanded our TCM session to include Tuesday.

Classes for the Children

In the fourth quarter of 2018, we conducted 10 sessions of Malay and English language classes on Saturdays, attended by 195 students in total, averaging 19 students per session. 93.75% of the students reported a better understanding of the learning materials that were taught in quarter four. The monthly yoga and singing classes are still ongoing.



Vegetable Garden for the Community

In the fourth quarter of 2018, we harvested 145.5kg of vegetables via 24 harvesting sessions, benefitting 108 GHCC beneficiaries. Crops grown in the quarter are cauliflowers, Chinese spinachs, Yardlong beans, mustard greens, bok choy, and tomatoes.

The visit continued with a "Heart Heart Coloring Competition" for the children, all of whom enjoyed the field trip very much.

Earth Warriors Project

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EARTH WARRIORS PROJECT

Weekly Earth Warriors Project

In the final quarter of 2018, 13 weekly Earth Warriors sessions have been conducted in Shah Alam, Jenjarom, Klang, Sekinchan, and Kuala Lumpur. We have also started rubbish weighing as practice to measure the amount of rubbish collected during each Earth Warriors session.



JENJAROM TEAM

With the assistance from 15 volunteers, the Jenjarom Earth Warriors team conducted 3 sessions of clean-ups along Jalan Sawi 3 and Jalan Bacang 2, collecting 77kg of rubbishes along the way.



KUALA LUMPUR TEAM

Kuala Lumpur Earth Warriors team is spearheaded by students from Erican College. The team organised one clean-up activity at the vicinity of the LRT Sungai Besi station, collecting 28kgs of rubbish. This team may be small in numbers but is certainly not small in their love for the environment!



KLANG TEAM

The Klang Earth Warriors team cleaned up the stretch along Jalan Batu Nilam 1 and Jalan Solok Kapas in 2 sessions. Volunteers from Persatuan Penganut Dewa Wei Ling Tan Klang also joined in, collecting a total of 500kg of rubbishes.



SEKINCHAN TEAM

Sekinchan Earth Warriors team conducted 6 clean-up sessions along Jalan Orkid 1, Taman Indah, Jalan Mawar 1, Jalan Aman 2, Jalan Pasar, and Redang Beach, with the assistance from 33 volunteers.



SHAH ALAM TEAM

A clean-up activity was done at Kota Kemuning Lakeside Park with the help from 15 volunteers, collecting a total of 47.5kg of rubbishes.

EARTH WARRIORS PROJECT

Mangrove Rehabilitation and Clean-Up Project

Great Heart Charity Association (GHCA) organised the fourth edition of the Mangrove Rehabilitation and Clean-up Project at Kampung Sungai Janggut, Kapar on 23 November 2018. This edition is held in collaboration with Wipro Unza (M) Sdn Bhd and the Forestry Department, with 400 mangrove saplings being replanted to rehabilitate the mangrove forest at Kampung Sungai Janggut area. This project is run to raise public awareness and encourage preventive action to curb mangrove forest destruction. With the additional 400 mangrove saplings, nearly 1,000 mangrove saplings have been replanted throughout all four editions of the project in 2018!



Great Vision Charity Association

Great Vision Charity Association is a non-profit, voluntary charity association that emphasizes the important role that education and awareness plays in transforming our society and embraces the philosophy that "to give a man a fish and you feed him for a day; teach a man to fish and you feed him for a lifetime" in our charitable work.




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Shopping Buddy Program

In the fourth quarter of 2018, 30 families from PPR Pantai Ria participated in the Shopping Buddy Program that ease their groceries burden, with 10 different families being chauffeured to a groceries shopping session every month. This quarter saw an increase on the support amount to RM300 per family from the previous RM100 per family, with the additional RM200 per family coming from GHCA. 53 volunteers helped out in the program by acting as the *shopping buddies* for October to December 2018.



FAMILIES HIGHLIGHTS



SHAKILA

Puan Shakila has a big household of 17 children with many of them still schooling. The groceries support of RM300 from the Shopping Buddy Program has helped to reduce her household burden and ensure sufficient food is put on the table for her 17 children.



KRISHNA

Mr Krishna has a disability in hearing and works as a cleaner at the PPR. He is a kind person and has a soft heart towards animals. His disability doesn't stop him from rescuing many injured animals and nurse them at his home until they are back in health. Being at a disadvantaged situation certainly does not prevent one from doing good and contributing back, as shown by the action of Mr Krishna who provides for the rescued animals.

PRUKasih Program

In the fourth quarter of 2018, 162 residents from 141 households have been successfully enrolled for the program via monthly recruitment drive and house visitation. A total of 25 claims related to illnesses, accidents, and death have been filed by the PRUKasih members, with RM21,208.00 worth of claims been approved for disbursement to the affected members.

KAMARUL (DEATH CLAIM)

In October, Kamarul lost his father over cancer. His father was a PRUKasih member, hence as a beneficiary, he was entitled to receive death benefits, housing allowances, and food allowances that help to relieve the sudden loss of income for the family. Kamarul has utilised the funding to cover for his father's funeral expenses.



JAMILAH (ILLNESS CLAIM)

Puan Jamilah worked as a babysitter for 6 children. Due to illnesses, she has cut down the number of children under her care, resulting in a major decrease in income. She received food and rental aid for 5 months to help ease her financial burden while she recuperates.



SELVER RAJU (ACCIDENT CLAIM)

Mr Selver Raju worked as construction worker and met with an accident at work which broke his leg. He has been on MC for over 3 months. Food and rental aid from PRUKasih allowed him to stay focus on getting medical treatment to recuperate.

Didik-Kasih EduCare Program

The Didik-Kasih EduCare program aids underprivileged students in pursuing their tertiary studies by providing them with study aid fund. In return, the students are groomed to organise and lead a charity project to give back to the society. In the fourth quarter of 2018, there were 9 candidates enrolled with the program, with 1 of them having completed her studies in ACCA and is currently serving as a trainee in PricewaterhouseCoopers. 2 of them also conducted their respective charity projects for the program in the fourth quarter.



TOUR TO NATIONAL SCIENCE CENTRE

Priyanka (standing, first from left) organised a tour to the National Science Centre for 28 children from The Selangor Children Welfare Home, accompanied by 10 volunteers. The children had a fun session learning about science through various experiential exhibits. Priyanka showed great leadership in guiding the volunteers to bond with the children and had a memorable time together. By the end of the event, the children gave hugs to Priyanka and thanked all the volunteers.



CARE AND SHARE WITH SHELTER HOME

Chia Yee (front row, first from right) conducted her charity project by spending half a day with 15 children from Shelter Home. Being formerly from Shelter Home herself, Chia Yee shared about life after Shelter Home and how she manages her studies, social life, and finance.
