HAND-IN-HAND CHARITY PROGRAM

Individual Cases – Dialysis Aid

In the second quarter of 2021, our Dialysis Aid Program supported 27 kidney failure patients from the low-income or unemployed group, compared to 31 patients within the same period in 2020. Each patient receives a dialysis fee subsidy ranging from RM130 to RM1,500 per month to ease their burden. From these 27 beneficiaries, 5 are new cases. GHCA is very thankful towards GlobalGiving (support for beneficiaries 1 ~ 8), Daniel Chin's Twitch Community (support for beneficiaries 9 ~ 11), and Top Glove (support for beneficiary 12) for their support this quarter. CHAN SHI LING

Mdm Chan, 35, has high blood pressure, diabetes, kidney failure, and partial blindness. In May 21, her joss money folding job picks up, and she can earn RM200 monthly compared to RM50 in the last quarter. Seeing her determination for a better life, GHCA extended her aid for 6 months.

HAND-IN-HAND CHARITY PROGRAM



CHAN HUNG MEI

Mdm Chan, 74, lives with her retired husband and son. She has high blood pressure, diabetes, and kidney failure. In Jun 21, her husband passed away due to Covid-19. She now places all her hopes to obtain MOH aid approval for her dialysis.



GOPAL A/L SINNTHAMBY

Mr Gopal, 65, unemployed, has diabetes, high blood pressure, and kidney failure. He is a right leg amputee. He had almost depleted his wife's savings for his dialysis treatment. Currently, he is in the appeal process for SOCSO aid.



VEERANAN A/L PAMPASAMY

Mr Veeranan, 62, stays with his wife and teenage daughter. He has high blood pressure, diabetes, and kidney failure. In Apr 21, he developed walking complication. GHCA provided him with a commode for assisted toileting as per his request.



LEE AH MOI

Mdm Lee, 68, widow, stays with her daughter. She is a double amputee with high blood pressure, diabetes, and kidney failure. She has applied for MOH subsidy and is currently waiting for the approval process.



WAHAB BIN MANGIN

Mr Wahab, 85, has high blood pressure, diabetes, kidney failure, and heart illness. He relies on his son's EPF for his expenses. In Apr 2021, he had applied for Zakat aid and is currently waiting for the approval process.



FOO KHEE YONG

Mr Foo, 68, divorcee, stays alone. He has kidney failure and depends on his siblings for a living, whose food business were affected by the FMCO. In May 20, he has applied for MOH and JKM aid and is now waiting for the approval process.



NIRMALA A/P VENGITTASAN

Mdm Nirmala, 35, stays with her lorry driver husband and is our past Dialysis Aid beneficiary. In Apr 21, after discharging from the hospital, she needs to cover RM40 for her dialyser per dialysis session and 5 times Epoetin injection weekly. Thus, GHCA will support her for 6 months.

HAND-IN-HAND CHARITY PROGRAM



CHELLAPPAN A/L KUPPUSAMY

Mr Chellappan, 71, has kidney failure. He relies on his car wash helped son and welfare aid. In Jun 21, his son was forced on unpaid leave due to FMCO. He is now applying for treatment at NKF Dialysis Centre to reduce his dialysis treatment fees.



LAI YOKE THYE

Mdm Lai, 57, widow, has high blood pressure, diabetes, and kidney failure. Her children struggle to cover her dialysis fee. In Apr 21, her clerk daughter's salary was reduced by 15% due to MCO 3.0. She now waits for her MOH aid approval.



AWRUONG A/P K. GOVINDASAMY

Mdm Awruong, 62, stays with her disabled son and daughter-in-law. In Jun 21, her application to switch to an NGO dialysis center was approved and will take place within 3 months. Thus, GHCA will extend her aid for a final 3 months.



CHONG KIM FUNG

Mr Chong, 63, has high blood pressure and kidney failure. In May 21, he has regularised his blood pressure and iron level. So, he no longer needs Epoetin injection. He has just applied the MOH and Bantuan Sihat Selangor aid. Thus, GHCA extends our support for 3 more months.



PANG PHEY SHUANG

Ms Pang, 35, single, blind, has kidney illness, and stays at a nursing home that is paid for by her sister. In Apr 21, her sister has now able to cover more of her dialysis fee. Thus, her aid was reduced to RM720.



HUSSEN BIN ABDULLAH

Mr Hussien, 61, lives with his wife, 49, who works as a maid. In May 21, his application to transfer his dialysis treatment to Baitulmal Dialysis Center was approved and he will longer requires our support from Jun 2021.



JAY KUMAR A/L R. SANJEEVANTHAN

Mr Jay, 58, blind, diabetic, and has kidney failure, stays with his wife and two children. Due to the pandemic, his wife is still unable to look for new job. GHCA has extended him with a final 3 months RM360 monthly dialysis aid until Aug 21 to ease his burden.

HAND-IN-HAND CHARITY PROGRAM



THOO FONG MING

Mdm Thoo, 65, is a widow. She has high blood pressure, heart ailment, and kidney disease. In May 2021, she stopped her toy stall business due MCO but has found a room tenant for her house. She now relies on the rental as her income.



NG CHEE YING

Mr Ng, 55, a leg amputee, has high blood pressure, diabetes, and kidney failure. In May 21, he was hospitalised for bacterial infection during dialysis treatment. After being discharged in Jun 21, GHCA helps him to cover his extra dialyser fees as well.



CHIA TEK MAU

Mdm Chia, 58, has high blood pressure, diabetes, and kidney failure and had to move to a nursing home to facilitate her dialysis treatment. In May 21, her MOH aid has been approved and she will no longer requires our assistance.



TASAN A/L BERAN

Mr Tasan, 79, has walking complications, high blood pressure, diabetes, and kidney failure. In Apr 21, our aid was reduced to RM720 to reduce their over dependency on GHCA, as there has been no extra effort from his daughter and son-in-law to increase their income level.



EMMANUEL A/L N.ARUNASALAM

Mr Emmanuel, 27, has kidney failure. In Apr 21, he found work as a driver for airport workers and as a school student transporter. Seeing his stabilising income, GHCA reduce our aid to RM720 and extended it for 3 months until Jul 21.



DEVANAH BIN HASSAN

Mr Devanah, 58, lives alone in his brother's house. He has kidney failure and relies on SOCSO and JKM aid for his expenses. In May 21, his Baitulmal application was rejected. Thus, GHCA extended his dialysis aid for another 3 months.



LAU SAID NI

Ms Lau, 40, has kidney failure. Her dialysis fee is partly supported by SOCSO. She runs a hawker stall for a living. In Apr 21, her business improves but was affected again in Jun 21 due to FMCO. Thus, GHCA extended her aid for another 3 months to ease her burden.

HAND-IN-HAND CHARITY PROGRAM



MUHAMMAD AZLI BIN ABDULLAH

Mr Muhammad, 27, has kidney failure and relies on his mother, 60, who is a 7-Eleven cashier, for a living. In May 21, he found a job as a restaurant cook. Seeing his determination to improve his life, GHCA extended his aid for 3 months as encouragement.



YAP KEAN SANG

Mr Yap, 65, widower, lives alone in a house rented by his relatives. He has no children, and has kidney failure, diabetes, high blood pressure and heart ailment. GHCA supported his dialysis from Apr 21. In Jun 21, his MOH aid has been approved, and he no longer requires our assistance.



ZULKIFLI BIN HUSSIN

Mr Zulkifli, 51, has kidney failure in Feb 21. His wife is also a kidney dialysis patient who just started her treatment. They have two children with low-income job. While Mr Zulkifli applies for SOCSO aid, GHCA supported him with RM720 monthly dialysis aid from May 21, that will be increased to RM1000 in Jul 21.



SANTHIRASEKAR A/L AYASAMY

Mr Santhirasekar, 37, has blurry vision and diabetes which deteriorates to kidney failure. He stays with his sister to reduce his rental. GHCA supported him with RM1000 monthly dialysis subsidy while he waits for his SOCSO aid approval process.



MOHAMAD KHAIRUL FITRI

Mr Mohamad, 27, has kidney failure, but still works as an Apple store salesman. His parents are in Perak while he moved to his sister's house in Selangor to ease his dialysis treatment. He managed to get SOCSO aid for his treatment and needs to cover the remaining RM500 monthly for his dialysis fee. GHCA supported him with RM360 subsidy monthly for three months.

Individual Cases – Family Care

In the second quarter of 2021, we reached out to 30 underprivileged families, compared to 29 families within the same period in 2020. 8 of these families are new cases. The beneficiaries listing is as follow:

Mdm Syakila, 31, single mother of 1, started a small, bottled honey business. In Jun 21, she began looking for sub agents for her business. She has also obtained a real estate negotiator license for part-time. Her aid will be converted to RM150 milk and diapers aid for her baby from Jul 21.

HAND-IN-HAND CHARITY PROGRAM



YUGESHWARAN A/L MAHENDRAN

Yugeshwaran, 16, is under our tuition aid. In Jun 21, as there is still no improvement in his grades despite going for tuition, his family has requested us to stop the tuition fees support provision.



TUNG BAO CHUAN

Bao Chuan, 10, lives with his widowed fishing net mender mother. GHCA extended his rental aid at RM150 for three months from Jul 21, and advised his mother to seek for a higher paying job.



VANATHAYEE A/P APRAVOO

Mdm Vanathayee, 78, requires diapers due to a broken hip. In May 21, GHCA successfully referred her to a charity group that caters to her diaper supplies. Thus, she no longer requires our aid.



LEE CHEN WAI

Mr Lee, 25, has numerous illnesses and must visit the hospital often. After May 21, he no longer requires our aid as we managed to refer him to an NGO that will cater his hospital transportation.



PATMALOSNI A/P MURUGIAH

Mdm Patmalosni, 31, is a mother of 5. In May 21, she managed to secure a part-time cleaner job. GHCA extended her aid for 3 more months until Sep 21 as she is still looking for a full time job.



SITI FARIDAH BINTI MD KHAMARUDDIN

Mdm Siti, 32, is visually impaired and has kidney failure. In Apr 21, her EPO injections had to be increased as her blood count decreases. Thus, GHCA extended our aid for another 6 months.



ZALEHA BINTI MOHD SALLEH

Mdm Zaleha, 40, mother of 4, has a Down syndrome son. In Jun 21, the income from her fried food stall that we helped to setup had stabilised. Thus, she no longer requires our aid.



ROSHAIZAN BIN ABDUL WAHAB

En Roshazain, 47, father of 2, was a cancer survivor. In Jun 21, he successfully applied for an MBSJ stall, which will open in a few months' time. However, due to FMCO, his nasi lemak stall is deeply affected. Thus, his support was extended for 3 months until Sep 21.

HAND-IN-HAND CHARITY PROGRAM



WONG CHEE LEONG

Mr Wong, 55, is physically weak due to intestine cancer. In Jun 21, the income generated from his wife's food catering business had improve markedly. Thus, he no longer requires our aid thereafter as they could now support themselves.



AMISAH BINTI MOHD ISA

Mdm Amisah, 35, widowed mother of 4, is deaf and mute. In Apr 2021, she had resumed her burger stall business but had stopped in Jun 21 for fear of the pandemic affecting her children. Thus, GHCA extended her support for 3 months.



GAN POH HONG

Mdm Gan, 45, is a mother of 6. Her metal factory worker husband and eldest daughter work to support the family. In May 21, her daughter has secured a job as an office admin, and no longer requires our aid.



NEROSHA A/P KRISHNAN

Ms Nerosha, 27, is wheelchair-bound. In May 21, her part time job selling biscuits online was affected by FMCO. Thus, we extended her aid for 3 months at RM300. We also managed to secure her diaper supplies for 6 months from a donor.



NUR QISTINA BALQIS BINTI ZAIPUL

Nur Qistina, 12, sits for her UPSR this year. In Jun 21, with her tuition, she has seen improvements in her studies. Hence, GHCA will extend her tuition fees support for another 5 months.



TAN HOCK CHUAN

Mr Tan, 51, father of 3 schooling children, was our beneficiary in 2019. He has high blood pressure and brain surgery and is now on medication. He is unfit to work due to his condition. Thus, his rental aid is still ongoing.



CHUA SENG HENG

Mr Chua, 70, is one of our frequent vegetable garden volunteer. He stays with his siblings, all low-income earners working as tailor, cleaner, and security guard, who are all affected by the MCO and in need of assistance. Thus, his rental aid support is still ongoing.

HAND-IN-HAND CHARITY PROGRAM



MUNIRA BINTI ANUAR

Mdm Munira, 34, stays with her 2 young children and parents. She is recovering from postpartum infective endocarditis and thromboembolic stroke. Her aid was extended for 6 months while she waits for her JKM aid application. In Jun 21, she is able to walk back by using a walking stick.



VANI A/P RAMA

Mdm Vani, 36, single mother with four young children, had lost her cleaner job in Oct 20. In Apr 21, she started sewing fabrics and manage to earn a decent income. Her grocery aid is ongoing.



KRISHNAH DEVI A/P P.SOPRAMANIAM

Mdm Krishnah Devi, 62, has diabetes, high blood pressure, kidney failure, heart ailment and stroke. She stays at a nursing home. In Jul 21, she had unfortunately passed away. Thus, our support ended after Jun 21.



GOVINDASAMY A/L NADASAPATHAR

Mr Govindasamy, 76, is a widower, who's wife passed away in Feb 2. He relies on his SOCSO pension for a living, and struggles with his rental. GHCA's rental aid is ongoing to ease his burden.



KARPPAGAM A/P AROKIANATHAN

Mdm Karppagam, 44, single mother of two, has high blood pressure, diabetes, and amputated her left leg. In Apr 21, she is waiting for her SOCSO aid approval for a prosthetic leg. Thus, we extended her hospital transportation aid until Jul 21.



HARINI A/P KANANBATHI

Harini, 14, has Crohn's disease and needs to consume Ensure milk as her diet. In Jun 21, her house painter father's income was affected by the FMCO. Thus, other than the ongoing aid, GHCA extended an ad-hoc groceries assistance to her.



NG CHIE TEING

Ms Ng, 43, single, is undergoing chemotherapy at the hospital for Stage 4 breast cancer. 80% of her medical fee is covered by insurance. GHCA provided her with 3 months medical aid until Jun 21, after which she will be supported by her sister as well as her SOCSO pension.

HAND-IN-HAND CHARITY PROGRAM



FARHA BINTI RAMLI

Mdm Farha, 35, lives with her low-income earner husband and 3 children. GHCA helped her start a food stall business with 3 months of business aid. In Jun 21, she stopped her business to take care of her mother who just had kidney failure. Thus, her aid will be switched to grocery aid from Jul 21.



TOH LAI FAH

Mdm Toh, 44, single mother of three, stays with her father, 73. She lost her factory job during the pandemic and is actively looking for a job. She now relies on her barista son and JKM aid. GHCA assisted her with groceries support until Sep 21.



NG YUEN HO

Mdm Ng, 72, lives with her disabled brother, 86, both receiving JKM aid. She is bed-ridden and must consume Ensure milk powder. GHCA catered her milk supplies from Apr to Jun 21, upon which a relative has come forth to assist her.



ABHISHEK A/L THURAIRAJA

Abhishek, 7, has Crohn's disease and must take Ensure milk powder. His breadwinner mother is a factory worker. GHCA aided him with RM450 milk powder supplies for 3 months. We extended the support to Sep 21 at RM300 monthly after Jun 21.



THINES A/L MOROLEDARAN

Mr Thines, 32, stays with his wife, son, mother-in-law and brother-in-law. He is the breadwinner, working as a part time food caterer. GHCA provides him RM300 grocery aid from May to Jul 21, while they look for more job opportunities.



TAN SIEW CHEN

Mdm Tan, 40, was our family care beneficiary in 2017. In May 21, she started a nasi lemak business, earning RM1,500 monthly. GHCA aided her with business grocery support from Jun 21 to help her weather the current bad economy.



KIRAM BIN ABDULLAH

Mr Kiram, 48, stays with his 6 young children. He collects recyclebles for a living. In Jun 21, he met a road accident, injured his legs, and is unable to work temporarily. Thus, GHCA provided him with RM300 grocery aid while he recuperates.

HAND-IN-HAND CHARITY PROGRAM

Ad-Hoc Cases

In the second quarter of 2021, we assisted 15 underprivileged families with ad-hoc emergency funding compared to 6 families within the same period in 2020. The increase in support is largely due to the FMCO in Jun 21 that affected the respective families' income. Our appreciation to Mr Joshua Tien for sponsoring all 13 of our ad-hoc cases in Jun 21. Mdm Mariammal, 44, was our Family Care beneficiary. Her income as a cleaner and Rela was affected by the FMCO in Jun 21. Thus, GHCA supported her with an ad-hoc RM300 assistance to purchase groceries for her family.

Mdm Loo, 54, widow to a schooling son, was our Family Care beneficiary. Her income as a market stall helper was affected by the FMCO in Jun 21. Thus, GHCA supported her with an ad-hoc RM150 assistance to purchase groceries for her family.

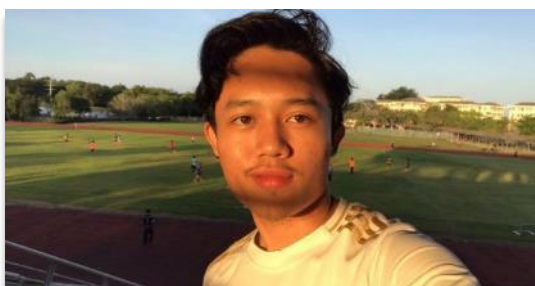
YONG LING HUAY

As he needed access to a computer urgently for his semester examination, GHCA provided him with an ad-hoc assistance to obtain a laptop.



SITI MAFUZAH BINTI MAT JALI

Mdm Siti Mafuzah, 36, stays with her factory worker husband and 4 children. She was a school driver, whose income was affected with the school closure. In May 21, she wanted to venture into a home sewing business. Thus, GHCA supported her with RM2,500 in sewing materials. She has since received the big order from a boutique shop with sales that could earn her RM7,500 in profit.



KALAIVAHNI A/P MALAYALAM

Ms Kalaivahni, 42, and her son Dayanidhi, 15, was our Family Care beneficiary, who bake cookies for a living. In May 21, her oven spoiled, and she needed a replacement to continue her business. GHCA provided her with an ad-hoc assistance of RM1073.30 to subsidise the purchase of a replacement oven. She has since managed to generate monthly cookies sales of around RM500 from the new oven.

“DEDICATION OF LOVE” CAMPAIGN

On 1 Apr 21, we collaborated with the Dragon Ball II volunteer group to run a month-long “Dedication of Love” campaign to fundraise grocery supply for 220 beneficiaries from 6 charity homes in Melaka. The supplies include rice, Milo, coffee, biscuits, instant noodles, milk powder, cooking oil, and canned food. The homes involved are Kasih Sayang Prasanna (boys’ and girls’ home), Kasih Sayang Angel, Kanak-Kanak Ceria Bukit Baru, Happiness Center Klebang, and Agape Senior Home.



ZALORA T-SHIRT DISTRIBUTION

On 29 Apr 21, 140 beneficiaries from GHCC and 6 orphanages around Klang received supplies of brand-new t-shirts, courtesy from Zalora Malaysia. Social workers from GHCA assisted with the distribution, and the orphanages involved are Destiny Starting Point 1, Destiny Starting Point 2, Destiny Starting Point 3, Padmasambhava Children Loving Association, Klang Ekliptik Children’s Centre, and Rumah Ozanam Klang.



GROCERIES AID FOR 125 NEEDY FAMILIES

On 8 May 21, GHCA collaborated with the Kota Kemuning OCBC AL-Amin Bank for a groceries aid distribution to 125 urban poor families at GHCC. The families consisted of either single parent, old folks, the disabled, and chronic disease patient, and includes all three races of Malay, Chinese, and Indian. We hope to provide sufficient food for the families during Hari Raya Aidilfitri through the aid. The groceries, fully sponsored by Kota Kemuning OCBC Bank, are worth RM15,000 and includes rice, cooking oil, canned food, Milo, biscuits, and many more.

HAND-IN-HAND CHARITY PROGRAM

Orang Asli Villages

PAHANG ORANG ASLI KAMPUNG VISITATION

On 6 Apr 21, GHCA paid a visit to the Orang Asli villages of Kampung Petoh and Kampung Sawak to continue our Orang Asli Empowerment Project 2021, which will focus on equipping the villagers with facilities and supplies that will enable them to operate their own vegetable and fruit farms to generate income in the long run. During the trip, we delivered seedlings worth RM1,530 to the villagers of Kampung Petoh and groceries worth RM1,000 to the villagers of Kampung Sawak.



KAMPUNG BULUH TELUR BRIDGE RECONSTRUCTION

Kampung Buluh Telur is an Orang Asli village located in Kuala Kubu Baru. The village has around 100 villagers from 50 families. Most of them are farmers. The main access bridge to the village was recently damaged by flood water, causing the villagers difficulties to access their farm and other locations in the village. GHCA assisted to reconstruct a new access bridge, with funding provided GlobalGiving. The new bridge was completed on 1 Jun 2021, and accessibility to the village is reconnected.

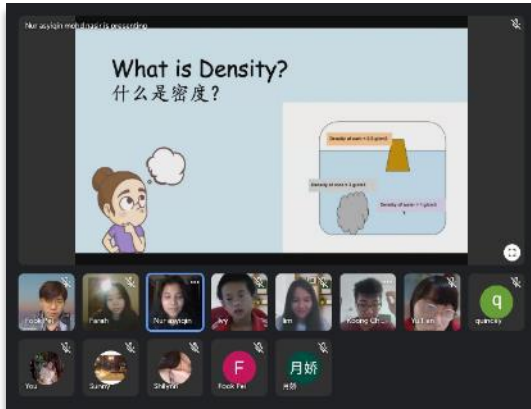

Student-Initiated Projects



TEACHING CHILDREN SCIENCE & MATHS

The children get to experience various Science experiments to improve their knowledge and learnt Maths through games in a virtual, fun, and interactive environment. The students hope that they were able to bring smiles to the children and bonded well with the children throughout the teaching process.



A BOX FOR EVERY SOUL

The 'A Box for the Soul' project was held from 19 May 2021 to 19 Jun 2021 by 10 students from Sunway University's School of Hospitality and Service Management for their Community Service subject. The students had fundraised RM1,500 to prepare lunch boxes for underprivileged families. However, due to the FMCO, this was changed to providing groceries to the Padmasambhava Children Loving Association instead, benefitting 49 children and residents from the home.



HYGIENE KIT FOR ORANG ASLI

With the increase in Covid-19 cases and the issue of Orang Asli children being unable to afford access to hand sanitisers and face mask, on 14 Apr 21, students from Ariston club, Heriot-Watt University collaborated with GHCA to provide hygienic kits consisting of hand sanitisers and face masks to 145 indigenous primary school children from SK(A) Bukit Tampoi. Sanitisers were also provided to representatives from the school for usage in the school compound.

Lunch Box for the Hungry



In the second quarter of 2021, 28 sessions of distribution were conducted, providing 4,898 packs of lunch boxes to our beneficiaries. As of end Jun 21, there were 178 enrolled beneficiaries for the program, consisting of urban poor families, elderlies, and needy students. Our appreciation goes to Persatuan Kebajikan Xin Dai, Pertubuhan Penganut Buddha Ci En Lin, Foo Guang Vegetarian Sdn Bhd, Mr Vincent Lai, 妙音堂, and Federal Donation Group for their support this quarter.

TCM Medical Check Up for the Needy

Due to the pandemic, the TCM Medical Check Up for the Needy Program was still suspended throughout the second quarter of 2021, until further notice.

Classes for the Children



In the second quarter of 2021, 57 sessions of Malay and English language classes were conducted virtually, attended by 313 students in total. There were 80% attendance rate from the enrolled students, of which 86% of them recorded improvements via assessments during the quarter under review.

Also happening in the second quarter, 18 children from the Classes for the Children program, aging from 5 to 14 years old, were granted free access to enrol in public speaking and learning skills online via the IntelliGenz platform. Special thanks to IntelliGenz for the support provided! Parents of the children commented that the IntelliGenz platform is a fantastic place for their children to gain soft skills that are not taught in school. The platform also offers a variety of different enrichment courses with constructive lesson plans that will boost the students' knowledge base.



Vegetable Garden for the Community



In the second quarter of 2021, 60kg of vegetables were harvested in 13 harvesting sessions, benefitting 71 beneficiaries and 28 neighbours. The vegetables grown this quarter are amaranth, bok choy, kangkong, Chinese mustard green, and banana.

Community Legal Clinic Services



Sponsored sessions of community legal clinic have commenced at GHCC beginning Apr 21 in collaboration with Messrs Tan & Yan Leong, where the public will be able to obtain sponsored legal advice with our partner lawyers. In the quarter under review, 5 persons benefitted from this initiative.

CERVICAL CANCER FREE SCREENING

In collaboration with Program ROSE and Persatuan Phor Thor Kota Kemuning, a free cervical cancer screening for 55 underprivileged women was conducted on 17 Apr 21 at Great Heart Community Centre. While 50 was the initial screening capping, all 55 women present at GHCC were privileged to receive a free check, thanks to the team from Program ROSE.



THE BODY SHOP VOLUNTEERING DAY

On 30 Apr 21, our friends from The Body Shop Malaysia paid GHCC a visit and volunteered their time helping out at our community centre. 15 staffs were present to assist us with harvesting, resoiling, and revitalising our community vegetable garden. They were also on hand to assist us with distributing the harvested fresh vegetables to our beneficiaries and help out at the Lunch Box for the Hungry program distribution session as well. Before ending their session, the team donated RM1,102 that will go towards our Lunch Box for the Hungry program.

LIFE AS A SOCIAL WORKER FORUM

On 26 Jun 21, GVCA was invited by the Penggerak Belia Selangor DUN Bandar Utama for an online forum to share about “Life as a Social Worker” to the youth audience. GVCA’s social worker, Nazihah Maiddin, shared her experience as a GVCA social worker in the 2-hour session. The audience were engaging, and the session was fruitful. Nazihah summed up her session by reflecting that we cannot change another person’s destiny, but we can create a new life journey for them.

PRUKasih Program

In the second quarter of 2021, 13 residents were onboarded into the program. 12 claims for illnesses, accidents, and deaths, totalling RM32,636 were processed and disbursed to the affected members. Meanwhile, for the PRUKasih-Taylor's Entrepreneurship Program, the two participants from PPR Pantai Ria under our care got to learn about the ins and outs of business management via online classes, taught by the lecturers from Taylor's University. They also learn to prepare presentation slides to do a business pitching for their business, with successful candidates standing to receive a RM1,000 grant that is aimed to help expand to their business.



PRUKASIH HIGHLIGHTS



SHASALI (ACCIDENT CLAIM)

Mr Shasali was a Grab driver. He injured his legs in a road accident and now relies on a walking stick for his daily activities. He is on medical leave and is unable to work for the time being. He received RM2,132 in claims from PRUKasih.



KHALID (ILLNESS CLAIM)

Mr Khalid was a mosque muezzin. He was infected with Covid-19 and was hospitalised for 10 days. He now has breath shortness and requires regular follow-up. He was also unable to work because the mosque is now closed. He received RM464 in claims which he saved for emergency funds.



ZAMBARI MAHMUD (DEATH CLAIM)

Mr Zambari was a food vendor. He passed away due to heart attack and left behind his wife and 4 young children. His wife, Mdm Rohaidah, also lost her babysitter income due to EMCO. She will be receiving RM9,988 in death claim benefit that will help to sustain her family as she tries to stand back on her feet again.

Didik-Kasih EduCare Program

In second quarter of 2021, there were 23 candidates enrolled with the program, aimed at providing needy students with a startup assistance and monthly study allowances for their tertiary education, while also guiding them to plan and conduct charity projects to give back to the society. Special thanks to BAT Malaysia Foundation, Wipro Unza, Mdm Tan Ee Hong, and Farah Saiful for their support in sponsoring our program students this quarter.

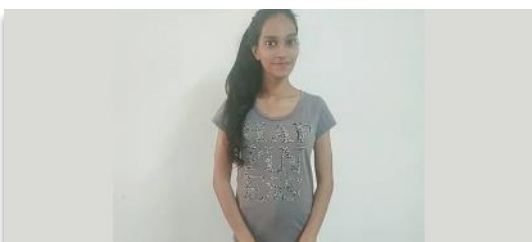
PRADEEP KUMAR A/L SUBRAMANIAM


